



Event highlights:

- Camping on the farm fields beside the Walloomsic where Col. Baum's men encamped. Standard amenities of wood, water, and latrines will be provided.
- Loyalists and .others will have an opportunity to be part of the work party that will hew logs to form the breastwork of part of that redoubt that will play a prominent role in the action
- Two marches, each approximately 3-4 miles each on Saturday, recreating the march of Capt. Pfister's Loyalists from White Creek, and the approach march of Col. Nichol's New Hampshire militia over the hills to the battlefield









Event Highlights:

- The pitched battle late on Saturday afternoon that swirled around the Dragoon Redoubt, culminating in the final desperate saber charge of the Brunswickers.
- The attack on the Tory redoubt on the east side of the creek on ground that is largely unchanged since 1777, and is still a mix of hay fields and stands of corn other grains
- The attack of Col. Breymann's reinforcements on Stark's troops and his counterattack with Warner's Green Mountain Boys that finally brought the battle to a bloody close.
