Fort Loudoun Facts

- History Built by the Colony of Pennsylvania in 1756 it was used to support the 1758 Forbes Expedition that took the French's Fort Duquesne.
- In 1765, following Pontiac's Rebellion, settlers upset with the resumption of trade with Native Americans forced the British garrison to evacuate the fort, part of an uprising known as the Black Boys Rebellion.
- The site is managed by a local volunteer group on behalf of the local township.
- The site is available to us for a non-public event which means the site is open to us, but the event is <u>not</u> advertised to public nor will it be open to the public.

Event Proposal

- We are proposing a non-public event by re-enactors for re-enactors. Something different!
- Usual amenities wood, straw, port o johns.
- Flexible schedule with multiple scenarios prepared for each day utilizing the fort and surrounding area.
- This will include small, open-ended scenarios using up to hundreds of acres of woods, trails, river banks, and open fields. Not just the fort.

Event Proposal


- Plenty of room to utilize for the event...and then some!
